## ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS AND RECIPIENT SELECTION PROCESS

- 1. The following information will be reviewed to determine the scholarship recipients:
  - a. Completed Applications
  - b. Scholastic Achievement: Grade Point Average (minimum 2.5 unweighted), S.A.T. and/or A.C.T. scores (if available), Class Rank, Course of Studies
  - c. Community Service, Extra-Curricular Activities and Leadership
  - d. Essay- minimum of 250 words, maximum of 300 words
  - e. Two (2) Letters of Recommendation (one school staff & one community representative) **NOTE: Letters from family/relatives will not be accepted.**
- 2. Top three (3) applicants from each county will be contacted for an interview.
- 3. The Scholarship Chairperson will notify recipients of its decision.
- 4. Recipients of the scholarship must matriculate to a two-year or four-year accredited institution.

Please complete all sections of the application. Incomplete applications <u>will not</u> be considered for the award. The deadline for submission is Friday, <u>April 21, 2023</u>. All application packets must be postmarked by this date.

2. <u>Two letters</u> of recommendation: One from a high school teacher, counselor, or administrator, and one from a community representative.

3. <u>For counselor use</u>: Please submit a copy of the applicant's transcript **and** a copy of ACT/SAT scores (if available), in a sealed envelope.

Completed application packet must be postmarked no later than Friday, <u>April 21, 2023</u>. <u>Packets will</u> <u>not be accepted if hand delivered</u>.
